Book pricing and the difficulties of assessing price averages.

Book Pricing and the Difficulties of Assessing Price Averages

In chapter 7 calculations based on simple averages of the prices of stock held by booksellers and printers have been used to consider book price trends. There are some clear practical difficulties in computing averages across stock of multifarious editions and qualities and styles of print finishing, with some stock in sheets, some collated and folded and some bound, and where testament details do not always adequately distinguish between these varieties of condition. The range of added value produced by book binding specifications can be seen in the table below which contrasts unbound and bound retail prices.

English binding was at least twice the cost of Scottish so acquiring English stock in sheets must have been the advisable option.

Domestic printers were more likely to hold bulk stock in unfinished form as well as stock bound in cheaper Scottish book bindings. Indeed, it is certain that the average price figures for stock holding printers understate 'real' average retail price levels and the larger the volume of stock per edition the greater the possible distortion in average price.

More realistic average price levels can be established by using current publishing accounting techniques when assessing the value of stock of generalised and unspecified nature in sheet and unfinished form. Thus to allow a more useful consideration of retail prices, a ratio of titles to volume can be computed (see table 8 for data). Those domestic printers with a ratio of over 500, indicating the stocking of large editions, can have their price averages multiplied by 40%, and those over 1000 by 50%. Lastly, those printers with a ratio of less than 500 can be given an increase of 30%. These multipliers have been selected to reflect the added value of book binding. This added value could range from 20% for Latin classics in the 1570s, and 13% for plain binding in the 1670s, to 100% for gilt bound New Testament folios in the 1570s, to 50 % for binding Sir David Lindsay's *Works* in 1736. For the printers in chapter 7 figure 6 the average prices (in scots) now rise to revised 'adjusted average prices':

Therefore, a strong case can be made for the use of the above adjusted prices as 'real' domestic prices and the differences between domestic and imported value and prices have been exaggerated. Nonetheless, and importantly for this research, overall price trends remain in place whichever form of average is in use, and the basic trends in the figures in chapter 7 are believed to be valid.
